Thailand. It has become a vital community resource

have conducted and published research, participated in academic conferences and community events,
and led numerous campaigns advocating for genuine political reform and respect for the human rights
of people of all ethnicities and religions in Burma.

In addition, more than 500 young adult migrant and refugee students in Chiang Mai have completed courses in English, health, and technology at **Burma Study Center**. Our branch libary in Hsipaw, Shan State, focuses on teaching language and environmental conservation skills to young people and farmers inside Burma/Myanmar.
